This event is a state qualifying shooting sports match for 4-H Archery. All levels of shooters are invited to participate from 4-H ages 9-18. The day will begin with FITA state qualifying match. Juniors (9-13 years old) will shoot 12 arrows at 30 meters and 12 arrows at 20 meters. Seniors (14-18 years old) will shoot 12 arrows at 40 meters and 12 arrows at 30 meters. ***Please refer to the 2026 STATE MATCH RULES for competition guidelines. NOTE: Minimum age to participate in the State Match is 9 years old by Jan. 1, 2026.**

Minimum Scores to Qualify for STATE:

Recurve — 120 points out of 240; **Olympic — 140 points** out of 240;

Bow Hunter/Compound — 200 points out of 240; and **Open/Compound — 210 points** out of 240.

**Following the FITA matches, a 3D match will be held for anyone age 9 and up. 4-Hers participating in the FITA match may participate in the 3D match for free. Moms, Dads and families may participate in the 3D match with on-site registration for \$5 per shooter. All 3-D scorecards must be turned in by 1:00pm.

Registration form and fees are due by Monday, August 10, 2026. Registration fees are \$15 per shooter. Registration will only be accepted from one person per county, if flights are necessary this contact person will be notified. Fees are payable to Greenwood County 4-H Archery.
